Kitchen at Saltaire Primary School

The change in the education system from 'three-tier' to 'two-tier' has brought with it a few potentially ticklish problems. Two-tier invariably results in 'more pupils per site' and one obvious side effect of that phenomenon is the necessity to provide larger kitchens to cater for all those extra mouths!

Within the Bradford area of West Yorkshire, Hygienic Installations has completed over 30 such kitchen upgrades. Typical work undertaken in refurbishment contracts of this nature involves re-lining the walls in Hygienic's Thermopanel - a 10mm thick PVC sheet which offers wipe-clean foodsafe surfaces with Class 'O' fire resistance. The walls tend to be lined from floor to ceiling with any pillars, reveals and corners being thermoformed on site. This creates a totally sealed, wipe down, impervious surface as required. Special cill details are installed to complete the aesthetics. Installation is generally completed over a scheduled school holiday period.

In addition to kitchen upgrades, Bradford Education Authority has also entrusted Hygienic with upgrading the ceilings of many school sports halls. The answer here is the Stripclad system - flush fitting, white uPVC planks giving an eminently pleasing
